Person-Borne Detection

"A different response and a leash make this dog everything you need when searching crowded events, airports, other transportation hubs and city streets. We train these canines to execute single-purpose narcotics, weapons, or explosive on-leash searches – but here's the twist. They are trained to follow the source of the response wherever it goes, giving you time to apprehend and interrogate the threat."

Gregory K. Baker became commissioner of the Law Enforcement Division, Dept. of Public Safety, on Sept. 10, 2013. Prior to this appointment, Baker lead DPS's Alcohol Law Enforcement section since May 2013.

Baker was a special agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation serving as a manager of FBI's Criminal Investigative Programs at both the national level and the field office level. He served as a special agent in the Raleigh FBI office since 2008. He also served five years in the FBI's Charlotte office and two years in the FBI's Washington D.C. headquarters as a supervisory special agent.

Baker earned a bachelor of science degree in criminal justice from University of Central Oklahoma.

The following business items were discussed:

- Ryan talked about the Atlanta ASIS Conference and then asked Pat King to say a few words. Pat mentioned that next year's conference will be held in Anaheim, CA. He also stated that due to the large turnout at these conferences, that there are only about 5 locations that could handle the conferences going forward.
- Pat King also mentioned that the Piedmont Chapter was recently selected to receive the 2014 Roy Bordes Award for Physical Security. Also they are hosting a two day program titled Contemporary Trends in Physical Security. This program will be October 27th and 28th at the Embassy Suites in Greensboro.
